- RMHC Singapore is a private charity registered under the Societies Act and not an Institution of a Public Character (IPC). We abide strictly by the corporate governance code • set by RMHC Global and the local Singapore charity council. Our finances are independently audited

- every year in accordance with local regulations.
- RMHC Singapore maintains a Conflict of Interests Policy applicable to all board and committee members, as well as all staff members. The purpose of the policy is to protect the interest of RMHC Singapore, so that no transaction or arrangement might benefit the private interest of an officer or board member of RMHC Singapore, or any other interested persons.
- In maintaining prudent oversight of our reserve funds, RMHC Singapore ensures that donated funds are used in areas that are in accordance

with our mission — to create, find and support programmes that directly improve the health and well-being of children whilst consistently building and maintaining adequate spendable reserves to keep the Charity's cause as a going concern. RMHC Singapore carries a surplus of funds no greater than three (3) times its previous year of Operating Expenses in unrestricted accounts. It also holds funds in a restricted account for specific purposes.

Having your child in the Intensive Care Unit can be a daunting experience. The only thing parents would want is to be by their child's side at all times. It was no different for my husband and I. Our daughter had to be admitted to the ICU following her heart surgery. We did not want to leave her side but at the same time, we also knew that we had to be well, physically and emotionally, so that we could focus on what's most important - the health and care of our daughter.

The Ronald McDonald House was truly a blessing because it is located just steps away from the ICU. It allowed us to have a comfortable respite while staying only a heartbeat away from our daughter. We felt at ease knowing that we could be by our daughter's side in the ICU without any delay, in the case of an emergency. The close proximity to the ICU team also enabled us to have better communication with them, and gave us the opportunity to witness their tireless care not only for our daughter, but also the other children in the ICU. We felt at ease knowing that our daughter was receiving the best care, and we really appreciated their hard work and dedication.

Having a room at the Ronald McDonald House also allowed my husband and I to be together so that we could be by each other's side and support each other during the trying times. At times when we felt overwhelmed and needed a break, the Ronald McDonald House offered a refuge from the stress of an ICU environment. The warm home-like environment as well as the amazing staff and volunteers of RMHC never failed to uplift our spirits. Being in a caring environment surrounded by parents going through similar experiences also gave us an opportunity to connect with and encourage one another.

With my baby's medical condition and her stay in the ICU, I was experiencing the fears and anxieties that parents face and this put me in a vulnerable position. However, being able to be close to my daughter at all times with a room at the Ronald McDonald House allowed me to manage my

anxieties. Research shows that a family's presence helps a child cope better and recover faster and I strongly believe that being able to be close to my daughter facilitated her recovery process.

While the medical team cares for the child at the ICU, the RMHC does an equally important and meaningful task of caring for parents. The RMHC truly keeps families close together!

Our daughter Destinee is a lovely 12-year-old girl who always looks forward to Sundays when she would attend Rock Kids church service.

One day, she was admitted to NUH due to a prolonged high fever for more than one week. At first, my wife and I thought it was just a normal virus attack and she would be discharged soon. But I knew something was not right after the fifth day as her fever never came down despite strong antibiotics. Our hearts sank when the news was told.

On 22 June 2016. Destinee needed a bone marrow test and Pat CT scan as the doctor suspected her condition could be Leukaemia. Her blood and platelets count suddenly dropped to below normal. The next day, the bone marrow test results came out negative, but her blood count continued to drop. On 24 June, the doctors told us she had features of Macrophage Activation Syndrome and critically inflammation with immune dysregulation. Her liver was massively enlarged. Treatment was given but her blood and platelets count continued to fall drastically to a "single figure" of 8!

(A normal person's is 100.) Her gums were bleeding and she was restricted to staying in bed. She needed red blood cell and platelets transfusion.

On 5 July, she was transferred to ICU when her platelets count came down to 1! The next day, she developed acute shortness of breath towards the end of a red blood cell transfusion. She was given positive pressure ventilator support. At this point, staying beside her constantly, we were introduced to the Ronald McDonald House and were told that the facility could literally help us stay closer to Destinee.

Given the numerous investigations and treatments Destinee was going through, comfort and encouragement was what we needed – and the Ronald McDonald House saved us during our darkest hours. We had space to think about what else we could do for Destinee. And we were so close to her that my wife and I could take turns to be at her bedside.

Our day-to-day needs like being able to cook simple meals were met and basic items like coffee and Milo were provided by RMHC. I was so grateful that the

Charity had thought through to the last detail to alleviate the stress of the families. The volunteers, part-timers and night security guard Jothy were a wonderful help. Just talking about anything at all relieved me and kept me sane.

We stayed at the Ronald McDonald House for 26 days and despite my state of mind, I saw how committed and dedicated the full-time staff were, especially Ms Meem and Leonard, whom we would like to thank dearly for all the care and concern they gave - always asking if we had eaten and always offering us food whenever they returned from the supermarket. Such small things are so touching and we wish NUH would have more rooms so that more families can be kept close together. With 18 beds at PICU and only 4 rooms at the Ronald McDonald House, I'm sure more would be welcomed by families like us.





PROMOTING POSITIVE MENTAL HEALTH IS AN IMPORTANT AREA IN OUR PURSUIT TO CREATE. FIND AND SUPPORT PROGRAMMES THAT **DIRECTLY IMPROVE THE OVERALL WELL-BEING OF CHILDREN AND** ADOLESCENTS.

We are very pleased to partner with the Institute of Mental Health (IMH), the only gazetted psychiatric hospital in Singapore designated as a "Place of Safety" for children and adolescents who require in-patient psychiatric evaluation and management.

Renovation works on a new Ronald McDonald Family Room commenced in September 2017 within the IMH paediatric wing, to provide families of children and youth receiving treatment a place to rest in between visiting hours. It started operating in December 2017, followed by the official launch in January 2018.

Clearly, our collaborative partnership with IMH seeks not only to fill a service gap, but also create a positive impact on the quality of care for IMH young patients and their families.







OUR GRANT PROGRAMMES DEFINE US (UPDATES FROM OUR THIRD GRANT CALL)

GRANT-MAKING PROGRAMME

Our Grant-Making Programme started in 2014 and to date, has contributed \$520,000 to drive worthy initiatives at the National University Hospital (NUH), KK Women's and Children's Hospital (KKH), Institute of Mental Health (IMH) and the Cerebral Palsy Alliance Singapore (CPAS). Over 1,000 children in Singapore are now enjoying better well-being through the grants because of your generous support. In 2017 alone, we awarded a total funding of \$\$30,000 to the recipients.

Khoo Teck Puat – National University Children's Medical Institute, National University Hospital



Projects awarded:

• Back to Sleep Programme:

Funded the procurement of supportive sleep systems for children with significant neurological conditions and multiple disabilities, helping them improve sleep quality and increase sleep duration.

• Equipment Resource Library:

Funded the procurement of rehabilitation equipment for its resource library to enable children with special needs with trial of equipment including home trial with an aim to help parents identify the appropriate, suitable device to be procured.

• NUHkids New Worlds Project:

Funded the creation of an immersive environment to improve the quality of the overall scan experience and reduce the need for sedation in children who need to undergo MRI scans.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

2017 was a good year with the construction of the Ronald McDonald Family Room @ the Institute of Mental Health (IMH) in September. By December, we managed to kick off test operations of the Family Room which soon ran at full capacity.

At the **Ronald McDonald House @ NUH**, we enjoyed 100% occupancy from May to December 2017 and served a total of 612 families in the year. We stayed faithful to the RMHC mission: "Keeping Families Close".

As a result of continuous organic support from corporate organisations and schools, we benefitted from their fundraising activities. Just to name a few: 3rd Graders of Stamford American International School fulfilled the wishes of RMHC Kids through their "Wish List Programme" during Christmas; McD Global Franchising Limited raised S\$17,722 through employee engagement; Liberty International Underwriters donated in-kind S\$6,000 worth of groceries to both facilities at NUH, and Sealy Asia (S) Pte Ltd changed all our mattresses, mattress protectors and pillows in the Ronald McDonald House.

Aside from these, we held, for a change, our **RMHC Charity Golf** at Singapore Island Country Club in October which

raised S\$178,430. We are most grateful for every effort in support of our Charity.

Notably, Hanbaobao Pte Ltd, the licensee of McDonald's Singapore, contributed and facilitated a donation of almost \$\$520,000 – which constitutes 75% of our overall expenditure in 2017.

smaller-scale initiatives meant a lot to our beneficiaries, mostly children and mums. We gave out 900 "Oncology Snack Packs" to cheer up the sick children following their oncology treatment. Mums also received our 40 "Tubs of Love" to help them cope with motherhood for their first time. The popular "Monthly Birthday Programme" at NUH Ward 47 sponsored by several organisations and schools delighted the kids and nurses each time with fun and games. Frequent visits from Ronald McDonald brought smiles and laughter to all children, nurses, housekeeping and even doctors!

Thanks to our sponsors and volunteers, we are committed to keeping these initiatives going as long as we can.

The RMHC Grant-Making Programme which started three years ago is still supporting ongoing projects. Over 1,000 children in Singapore are now enjoying better well-being through the grants because of your generous

support and we will continue these projects.

As we all know, volunteers are the heart of every charity and it is important for us to find ways to retain them. For the first time, we celebrated **RMHC Volunteer Appreciation Day/Night 2017** at the Singapore Zoo.

It is gratifying that the many things we do at RMHC Singapore are possible because of our donors, volunteers and supporters. On behalf of RMHC Singapore, I would like to extend our deepest appreciation to all who have contributed in one way or another in supporting the mission and growth of the charity.

On a personal note, I will be leaving the RMHC after a fulfilling 2 years with the charity. I have learnt so much from the families I meet with everyday, and our kind donors and volunteers. I wish my successor and the team at RMHC even better years ahead with furthering the charity's cause.
